I am writing to you regarding the evidence that will be used to form the basis for A Level and equivalent grades this year.

Schools will use a broad range of evidence. This will include work completed in class, work completed at home and end of topic tests. This evidence informed the data collection point in November that you were given in the form of a report. In some subjects, teachers will also use a selection of assessments that were completed independently. The details of the assessments are given in the attached table.

In addition to the evidence outlined above, the majority of subjects are giving students the opportunity to demonstrate their learning through a series of in-class assessments. The topics for these are outlined in the attached document.

Non-examined assessment (often referred to as coursework) will be used as evidence in the following subjects:
