Just before the pandemic began, the students had worked really hard on their designs and had developed a range of prototype parachutes. They were then able to test these from the balcony at school, focusing on size, shape and materials of the parachutes to determine the most successful idea.

However, the students were very successful in the work they had produced and are all really keen on pursuing a career in Engineering and Design. at Rolls Royce

Louise has taken part in the Employer Led Programme since Year 12. This enabled her to develop key employability skills for her CV through a series of virtual skills masterclasses, workshops and virtual work experiences alongside her studies. Louise also joined the sixth form Apprenticeship Preparation Programme which enabled her to join live sessions with apprenticeship employers to find out what they are looking for in an interview and how to prepare for the selection process. Louise took full advantage of the support on offer and attended as many sessions as she could, enabling her to create a strong application for her apprenticeship.

Louise applied for the degree apprenticeship in January in which she undertook an intense selection process. The process involved three online assessments in numerical, verbal and logic tests, in which she was successful in passing and gained a place onto the online assessment day via Microsoft Teams. The day involved a presentation on renewable energy, focusing on turbine power and future renewable sources, as well as a final one-to-one interview. Shortly after this, Louise received confirmation that she had successfully secured a place onto the degree apprenticeship course. Louise is very excited to be starting with the company and hopes to encourage and inspire the next generation of female students into joining this male dominated industry.

We would like to say a special thank you to Mrs Blee who worked so hard to organise the event. Well done to all students for their outstanding efforts.












