Re: Year 10 Geography Visits

Action May Be Required

I hope this letter finds you well. The Geography department is pleased to be able to offer your child the opportunity to visit Hornsea and Flamborough Head on Tuesday 20 May 2025 to investigate coastal erosion and deposition and undertake primary data collection to investigate changes along the coastline. On the 18 June 2025, we will also be visiting York and looking at land use changes in different areas of the city as well as undertaking different human geography data collection techniques. Both of these days have been designed to fit into your child's course and are valuable in terms of answering questions on the fieldwork paper that will be sat in Year 11.

For the coasts day, students will need to wear waterproof and warm clothing as we will be completing data collection on the beach throughout the day. Footwear needs to be sturdy and suitable for walking on the beach. For the urban day, students again will be outside all day so appropriate warm and waterproof clothing will be required. Students also require a packed lunch for both of these days; there will be no opportunity to purchase food. Both visits will take place within the school day, leaving at 8.45am and returning to school for 3.15pm.

As a school we try to keep the costs of our visits as low as we can, so that as many students as possible are able to take part. In this case, to cover the travel expenses, we are also requesting a voluntary contribution of **£32** to be transferred by 5 May 2025.

This can be transferred via your child's Arbor account. Under the Trust Charging Policy there is no obligation to contribute, and pupils will be treated the same whether or not a contribution has been received. However, failure to receive sufficient contributions could put financial restraints on other activities within this subject area. If you have any general queries or concerns, please contact the school at mary.allison@southhunsley.org.uk. If the contributions received fail to cover the overall costs then the visit may be cancelled. Where this happens, all monies will be returned. **Otherwise, payments are non-refundable.**

If your child is entitled to free school meals, you can request that a packed lunch to be provided for the visit. Please let me know using the email address above if you are eligible and this will be arranged with our catering team.



We are committed to working with parents and carers to make our visits accessible for all.
