1. A STABLE CAREERS PROGRAMME	Every college should have a stable, structured careers programme that has the explicit backing of the senior management team, and has an identified and appropriately trained person responsible for it. – The careers programme should be published on the college's website in a way that enables learners, parents, college staff and employers to access and understand it. The programme should be regularly evaluated, with feedback from learners, parents, college staff and employers as part of the evaluation process. LEARN FROM LABOUR MARKET INFORMATION	During their study programme, all learners should access and use information about career paths and the labour market to inform their own decisions on study options. – Parents should be encouraged to access and use information about labour markets and future study options to inform their support to the learners in their care. 3. ADDRESS THE NEEDS OF EACH STUDENT	A college's careers programme should actively seek to challenge stereotypical thinking and raise aspirations. – Colleges should keep systematic records of the individual advice given to each learner, and subsequent agreed decisions. – The records of advice given should be integrated with those given at the previous stage of the learner's education (including their secondary school) where these are made available. Records should begin to be kept from the first point of contact or from the point of transition. – All learners should have access to these records to support their career development. Colleges should collect and maintain accurate data for each learner on their education, training or employment destinations. The eight Gatsby Benchmarks for good career guidance were developed through a study of schools and colleges in six places – Finland, Germany, Hong Kong, Ireland, The Netherlands and Ontario – where career guidance is known to be good. This study, together with a literature review, a survey of English state schools and a costing exercise, resulted in a set of benchmarks identifying the different dimensions of good career guidance. Published in 2014, the benchmarks were further tested in a two-year pilot with 13 schools and three FE colleges in North East England from 2015 to 2017. The benchmarks have now been adopted as the organising framework for the Department for Education's Careers Strategy for School.
