Here are a collection of memories provided by some of our teachers and how they remember Mason, he will be sadly missed by the whole South Hunsley family and our thoughts are with his family and friends at this sad time.

### Mr Quinnell - Form Tutor

I have had the pleasure of being Mason's Form Tutor since he started at South Hunsley.

I remember vividly Form 7.01 first day, queueing up on the tennis courts. Most of the students looked lost inside uniforms that were a size too big for them. However I do remember seeing one young lad, stood in our form line trying his utmost

best to get the attention of another student who was almost the other side of the tennis courts. I looked at my register, and since they were standing in alphabetical order, realised this was Mason. I quietly went up to him and asked him to stop calling out across the tennis courts, he turned to me with a complete look of innocence on his face and said "Who? Me? I wasn't shouting out."

But immediately, his face turned from a look of shock to a cheeky grin.

And that is, and always has been, my image of Mason. Someone who is probably not doing the right thing some of the time, but because of his personality and sense of humour, you turn a blind eye (within reason!)

Another memory is when, each week, I ask the form to count up how many reward stamps they earned for the week. It got to Mason's turn, and he confidently said "96 stamps, sir". I looked at him, because the most anyone had got before was 67. "Really, Mason?" Without batting an eyelid, or looking at his planner, he then said '95 stamps, sir' again with that grin and look of innocence that he had. I went over to check – he had 26 stamps!

Mason also represented our form as Form Rep on the Student Council during Year 8. There were a few candidates, so we decided to hold a mini-election. 5 students stood up and explained why they deserved to be on the council, what they would do for the form, etc. Some were very eloquent, then it got to Mason's turn. Mason stood up, looked around and simply said "Vote for me!". Then he sat down to huge applause. Needless to say he won the election by a huge margin.

And that was Mason – he got on well with everyone in the form, and speaking to his teachers, he got on with them as well. He leaves a huge hole in our form and in our hearts, and we remember him with positive thoughts every day.

### Mr White - English

Mason was an absolute pleasure to teach - he was kind, respectful and impeccably behaved. He always put effort into his work and ensured he gave his best every English lesson. I will always be thankful for the short moments we had to talk about football or sport. He was quiet, unassuming and a calming influence to have in the classroom. He will be sorely missed.

### Mr Senior - PE

I was very lucky to have taught Mason in both PE and games lessons. He was a talented individual who always wanted to beat his partner Rattan. Together, they would always need reminding to get changed at the end of the lesson. Often trying to get one more point in, unless it was lunch time and they'd be off attempting to get into the lunch queue first.

Mason's best friend brought him to play rugby for school and I will always be proud to have seen him play.

### Miss Derry - Drama

Mason was an absolute pleasure to teach in Drama. He was a cheeky chappy with an infectious smile. He always had the ability to put a smile on our faces. He was the type of student that everyone wanted to work with. No matter what theme or topic we were exploring he always managed to find an opportunity to incorporate humour and make us all laugh! No words can express how sorry I am for what you are going through. He will be sorely missed!

### Mrs Allison - Geography

I've taught Mason Geography this year, he always arrived at lessons with a big smile on his face. Often because he had some joke or prank he was planning on playing on someone in the class. Mason was always full of fun, and brought a smile to everyone's face. He was a really polite student, who always responded well to any requests. Mason was keen to answer questions and always took part in class discussions. He is really missed in our Geography class.
