

MUSICAL MAYHEM Thursday 2 and Friday 3 March

South Hunsley School and Sixth Form presents Musical Mayhem – a celebration of the last decade of singing, dancing and acting in a range of well known classics from stage and screen.

The show opened with a rendition of *Consider Yourself* and *I'd Do Anything* from *Oliver!* a 1960s musical based on a novel by Charles Dickens.

Next on the bill was Fame, a musical film about a New York High School for Performing Arts. Our students performed the well known hits Fame and Hard Work.

The show continued with a scene from the musical homage to 80s megaband Queen titled We Will Rock You, with songs Radio Gaga and Seven Seas of Rye.

Horror comedy rock musical Little Shop of Horrors was next up, a story about a florist worker who raises a plant that feeds on humans. The ensemble performed Dentist and Don't Feed the Plants from this Broadway production. A rendition of the 1965 classic The Sound of Music treated the audience to popular songs So Long, Farewell, Do Re Mi and My Favourite Things.

Following a short interval, students sang *You're in the Band* and *Stick it to the Man,* rock hits from *The School of Rock* – a stage rendition of the 2003 movie.

Next on the bill was *Grease* with *Summer Nights* and *We Go Together* – a coming of age classic that has stood the test of time.

Our Sixth Form performers showed their spooky side with songs from stage adaptation The Addams Family, with When You're an Addams and Pulled.

The show closed with High School Musical, the aptly titled musical film that has been a favourite with younger audiences since 2006. The whole ensemble joined together to perform Stick to the Status Quo before finishing with All In This Together – a high energy dance hit which had the audience bopping along too.



BARBARA HEPWORTH

Firstly she was a Yorkshire woman, beginning her artistic life by studying at the Leeds School of Art in 1920 and graduating from the Royal College of Art in London.

She was extremely ambitious, an activist and proud of her Yorkshire roots. She did all this as a wife and mother, all the while never losing her own vision of becoming a successful sculptor.

And I can say her tenacity has also spurred me on in my own career as an artist, also a proud Yorkshire woman, a wife and mother too.I recently received an ultimate recognition of my own artistic practice, I have been nominated for an award. And it comes from an associate of Barbara Hepworth too. I have won a Henry Moore Artist Award recently which was given to me by The Henry Moore Foundation in Hertfordshire.

MISS MOONE

DOLLY PARTON

Dolly set up a charity to help children read by sending every child a book in the USA from birth to aged 5 regardless of family income. This is done monthly and isn't just in the USA. She sends them to the UK also. Every month her charity sends out 2 million books. My niece is 3 and is beside herself every month when Dolly sends her a new book. She is amazing!

KATE RAWORTH

Because she shows how systems thinking has the power of reframing outdated and harmful narratives. Kate uses her brain and her background in economics to rewrite so that it's fit for tackling the 21st century's grand challenge of meeting the needs of all people within the means of the planet.

MY MUM

She pretty much single-handedly raised me during my teenage years at the same time as working as a teacher focused on students with behavioural problems. She has been a constant source of support as a mum and as an amazing granny to my little boy. I genuinely don't know where I would be or what I would do without my mum!

DR BULLIVANT

ANNEMIEK VAN VLEUTEN

One of the best cyclists in the world right now. She only took up professional cycling at 26 and won the 2022 Woman's Tour de France at the age of 39. Other recent achievements include the 2021 Olympic title trial-; four rainbow jerseys -two ITT Worlds (2017, 18) and two road race titles (2019 and 2022)-; three Giro Rosa overall victories (2018, 19, 22).

MISS BOWER

SOPHIE SCHOLL

Because she stood up to the Nazis. She was a German university student and a member of the anti-Nazi group the White Rose. She was convicted of high treason after having been found distributing anti-war leaflets at the University of Munich with her brother, Hans. As a result, they were both executed. On trial she said: "Somebody, after all, had to make a start. What we wrote and said is also believed by many others. They just don't dare express themselves as we did"

KATHRYN BURN

Monday 6 March

The Apprentice 2022 finalist Kathryn Burn joined us at South Hunsley to share her knowledge and experience of business with our Year 10 students as part of National Careers Week.

Kathryn Burn finished in 2nd place in the BBC boardroom TV show The Apprentice, having the opportunity to pitch her online fashion retail business to Lord Sugar and his associates. Five years ago Kathryn launched My Christmas Pyjamas, a matching pyjama company for families that ran

between September and December each year.

Kathryn spoke of her humble beginnings, having started My Christmas Pyjamas with just £50 from her home. The company soon grew enough that Kathryn was able to use a fulfilment centre who packaged and delivered her products on her behalf, which meant she had more freedom to work on other projects. In February 2022 Kathryn launched Pyjamily, an online store where families can buy matching sleepwear all year round.

Having tried a number of different career paths such as events management, working on cruise ships and training as a mortgage advisor, she ultimately wanted to have a more rewarding and flexible role which allowed her to be her own boss.

Students were able to take part in a Q&A session after the talk, as well as a select few being chosen to take part in a series of Apprentice-style tasks with Kathryn to learn more about business acumen, please read more overleaf.

THE APPRENTICE-STYLE WORKSHOP

Monday 6 March

A group of 17 students were picked to be involved in this unique opportunity to be involved in an Apprentice-style workshop. The task set was to come up with a new technology product that didn't already exist and is scientifically feasible. They had to come up with brand name, logo, strapline and

30 second commercial and present the idea to the rest of the group.

They were split in to three teams and had limited time constraints to think of a concept idea, choose a team name and decide who was Project Manager and Sub Team Leader. They were then divided in to their sub teams and couldn't

collaborate again until the meet up to discuss the presentation.

They did really well with conveying their ideas and collaborating together in a group. Each team came up with excellent ideas that were commercially viable and could benefit the community. They thought about their USP, target markets and revenue generation for their products. Presenting their ideas and answering questions afterwards.
